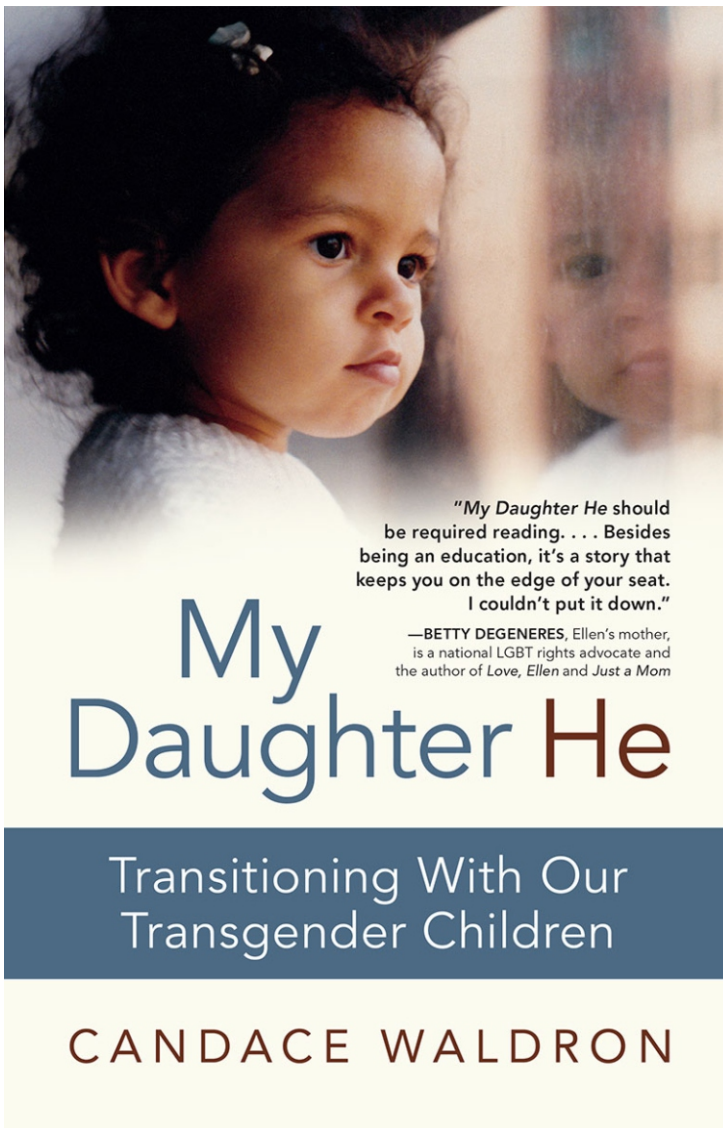


# Transitioning With Our Transgender Children
